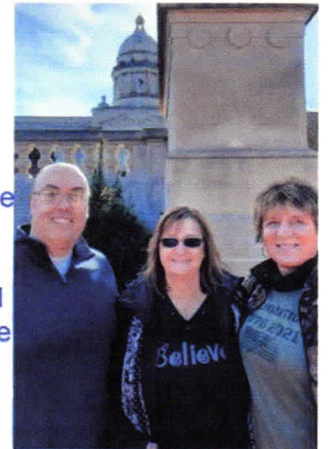


In December I was blessed to do the work of the ministry all across the state and be with some great people.
